"Come, Follow Me ..." (Mark 10:21)

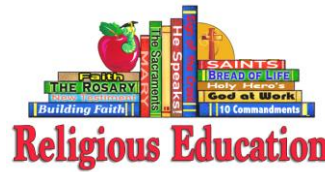
The 2018-2019 Disciples Response Fund campaign has begun with a mailing to all registered parishioners from Bishop Medley. All are asked to give generously in support of the important items funded by your contributions.

Support of the work of our Diocese is important. There are many things that even the largest parishes cannot do on their own. For example, the Disciples Response Fund puts money into an endowment for the care of retired priests. Also, the fund assists with the expenses for the education of our seminarians and provides operating income and scholarship funds for the Gasper River Catholic Youth Camp. Your gift to the 2018 DRF will make it possible for us to accompany others on their journey of faith.

In the 2016-2017 campaign, the Diocese began a system of returning 50% of the dollars received, over target, to the parishes for their use. Our parish received \$1,771.03. These dollars are assessment free and were used for parish expenses.

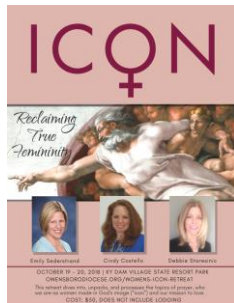
