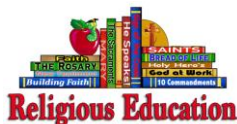
Remember items you must provide are: valid photo identification, original birth certificates for each child; proof of all income; proof of residency (water bill with your name and address listed). Don't miss this chance.

Some are hesitant to call 911 because they don't want to get anyone in trouble but this is far from the reality. Our police department will help them find food or housing, something we are not equipped to do at these late hours and remember to please lock your cars.
