Lord of Miracles – Sunday, October 28th: *(in Spanish:*

Señor de los Milagros de Nazarenas) is a mural painted of Jesus Christ that is venerated in Lima, Peru. It is the main Catholic festivity in Peru and one of the largest processions around the world.



As you know, this mural is now hanging along with Our Lady of Guadalupe on the wall in the church next to our flags. Our Hispanic Community has been gathering during the nine days prior to the celebration to pray the “Novena to the Lord of Miracles” which culminates with Mass on the tenth day at the **2:00 p.m. Spanish Mass Sunday, October 28th.** In addition to Mass there will be an outdoor procession. October 26th – 28th**


“Falling in Love, Staying in Love and Finding God in it All!” is a weekend retreat for married couples presented by

Seven Blesseds to be Canonized Sunday, October 14, 2018: Seven Blesseds will be canonized on Sunday, October 14, 2018, Check your local cable station for live coverage of this event with Our Holy Father, Pope Francis.

1. **Pope Paul VI** (Giovanni Battista Montini), Supreme Pontiff;
2. **Archbishop Oscar Arnulfo Romero** Galdámez, archbishop of San Salvador, martyr;
3. **Fr. Francesco Spinelli**, diocesan priest, founder of the Institute of the Sisters Adorers of the Most Holy Sacrament;
4. **Fr. Vincenzo Romano**, diocesan priest who worked with the poor of Naples, Italy until his death in 1831;
5. **Mother Maria Katharina Kasper**, virgin, German founder of the religious congregation the Poor Handmaids of Jesus Christ;
6. **Nazaria Ignacia de Santa Teresa de Jesús** (née: Nazaria Ignacia March Mesa), Spanish founder of the Congregation of the Missionary Crusaders of the Church.
7. **Blessed Nunzio Sulprizio** was born April 13, 1817 in the Abruzzo region near Pescara. Both of his parents died when he was an infant and his maternal grandmother, who raised him, died when

he was nine. He died in Naples in 1836 at the age of 19 and was declared blessed in 1963 by Blessed Pope Paul VI.

Monday, October 15th – Memorial of St. Teresa of Jesus, more commonly known as St. Teresa of Avila. She joined the Carmelite Convent of the Incarnation at the age of 21. Disheartened by the laxness of its observance of the Carmelite Rule, in particular its lavish nature and overly



social atmosphere, she began a reform movement laying the framework for the Discalced Carmelites. This new branch of Carmelites modeled themselves on the poor and crucified Christ, adopting a life of poverty and abstinence. In collaboration with St. John of the Cross, she helped bring this new way of life to the male Carmelite communities.

Although their reforms were met with great resistance, they moved forward with faith and persistence. Among her many writings, she is well known for two classics: *The Way of Perfection* and *The Interior Castle*. St. Teresa is one of the first women to be made a doctor of the Church. Known as a great contemplative, Teresa was also a great spiritual thinker and an energetic, lively person. She was a friend and mentor to collaborator the great mystic, St. John of the Cross. On her feast day considering praying in front of her statue:

The Prayer of St. Theresa of Avila

*Let nothing disturb you,
Let nothing frighten you,
All things are passing away:
God never changes.
Patience obtains all things
Whoever has God lacks nothing;
God alone suffices.*
