His latest release is, *Into His Likeness: Be Transformed as a Disciple*. Edward Sri is also the host of the acclaimed film series *Symbolon: The Catholic Faith Explained* and the presenter of several faith formation film series, including *A Biblical Walk through the Mass*; *Mary: A Biblical Walk with the Blessed Mother*; and *Follow Me: Meeting Jesus in the Gospel of John*. He holds a doctorate from the Pontifical University of St. Thomas Aquinas in Rome and is an adjunct professor at the Augustine Institute. He resides with his wife Elizabeth and their eight children in Littleton, Colorado.

KEVIN REILLY’S STORY isn’t merely about survival. It’s a tale of overcoming tremendous adversities and realizing the potential to be a true champion. When cancer surgery left Kevin Reilly without his arm, four ribs and a large portion of his left shoulder, many well-meaning people told Kevin he would no longer be able to carry on the life he’d been leading. Fortunately, Kevin ignored them. He went on to achieve incredible goals and overcome overwhelming obstacles that will make you marvel at the strength of the human spirit. Because when a human being is forced to come to terms with a serious disability, their personal victories frequently happen during those dark hours in the middle of the night when no fans will cheer for you and your toughest adversary is yourself.
