

Christmas Flower Memorial: Our church is always decorated with beautiful flowers and decorations during the Christmas season, but nice poinsettias and other plants can



needs us, who needs to know they are being remembered during this time of year. Can you be an "Angel" for a person?


Dave Ramsey's Financial Peace University: Beginning Sunday January 13th and continuing for 9 weeks Saints Peter and Paul will offer

He holds a doctorate from the Pontifical University of St. Thomas Aquinas in Rome and is an adjunct professor at the Augustine Institute.
