Youth 2000: YOUTH 2000 is responding to the call of Pope John Paul II who continually called upon the youth of the Church to be instruments and leaders of a new effort to bring the Gospel to the world. Pope Francis continues this challenge, “Jesus speaks in silence in the mystery of the Eucharist and each time reminds us that following him means to come out of ourselves



and not make our life our possession, but a gift to him and to others.” Youth 2000 continues to respond to these challenges through Eucharistic centered retreats. This is the 22nd anniversary of Youth 2000 in the Diocese of Owensboro. If you are a high school youth, you are invited to join us for this YOUTH 2000 Retreat scheduled for March 8th-10th on the Brescia University Campus Center. This retreat is being sponsored by the Diocesan Offices of Youth Ministry and the Diocesan Marian Shrine Committee. If you would like to help sponsor a young person, please see Libby. We will need adult chaperones for this event as well.

Feeding the Hungry: For many years Sts. Peter & Paul Parish, instead of having our own food pantry to assist those in need, has contributed to the community food pantry run by Aaron McNeil House. Our Knights of Columbus Council 7847 is now specially assisting this Parish endeavor and helping us expand our support of the pantry on a more consistent basis. The Council, in coordination with Aaron McNeil House (AMH), will conduct a monthly food drive beginning in February. They have purchased a large bin [located in the coat closet on the restroom hallway of the church] to collect non-perishable food donations. Non-perishables can be placed in the bin at any time, but will be collected on the 3rd weekend of each month except in November and December. During those months, the Parish, with the support of the Council, will continue to collect food items for specific families in the community prior to Thanksgiving and Christmas. As in past years, surplus food items from those drives will also go to the AMH pantry. Council 7847 is very pleased to assist the Parish in feeding the hungry of our community. With gratitude to God they encourage all to participate in this much needed mission of the Church. The food collection will have to be delivered to AMH, by us.
