As a parish we offer our prayers for this family as we pray to God “May his soul and the souls of all the faithful departed through the mercy of God rest in peace. Amen.”



All Saints Endowment: In November of 2005, The All Saints Endowment was established by the leadership of Saints Peter and Paul. The purpose of the endowment is to perpetuate, partially support and uphold the ministry of Saints Peter and Paul Catholic School. assistance for financially disadvantaged families, capital and technical improvements and for school employee’s salaries. The annual distribution rate is set by the board of the Catholic Foundation of Western Kentucky. The current distribution rate is 5%. This year, Sts. Peter and Paul received an annual distribution of \$16,831.51.

Contributions toward the endowment can be accepted at any time and can be, cash, check or securities. In October and November an envelope is included in the monthly envelope packet for those receiving envelopes. Hurricane Relief: Several parishioners have family members who live in Louisiana. They again have been affected as Hurricane Delta made landfall near Creole, Louisiana in the early evening of October 9th. This was the



second hurricane landfall in this region. Hurricane Laura made landfall only 12 miles away in August and the sixth tropical

storm to make landfall in Louisiana this year. We have been asked to help. Our assistance comes through the donation of cleaning products for the home as well as, hand and body soap, dish soap, detergent to wash clothes and bleach. The truck that will collect these items will be leaving Hopkinsville on Friday afternoon, October 23. We ask that all donations be placed in our church coat room by 12:00 – Noon, on Friday, October 23rd. So let us go now to the store and help where we can. Whatever you can do will be appreciated.

**Father Michael J. McGivney's Beatification

On Saturday, October 31, 2020

Father Michael J. McGivney, the founder of the Knights of Columbus will be one step closer to Sainthood as he is beatified through a special Mass in the Connecticut birthplace of the Knights of Columbus. As pastor of St. Mary's Church in New Haven, this dedicated parish priest gathered men together in the basement of his Church to help save widows and children from destitution and defend the Catholic faith. & A CALL TO ALL CATHOLIC MEN**


Catholic Men from around the world will join together on the feast of St. John Paul II and begin praying a special



Encyclical: Last week Pope Francis released his third encyclical, a letter written to all people of good will. It is entitled "Fratelli Tutti, On Fraternity and Social Friendship." The Holy Father reminds us that all human beings are brothers and sisters and that common bond is

more important than race, nationality or anything else that separates us. Until we recognize that truth our world will never know true peace. One theologian commented that "Fratelli Tutti" is a devastating challenge to our ecological, political, economic and social life, but above all, it is the proclamation of an ineradicable, joyful truth, presented as a well-spring for a fatigued world."
